Guest Speakers: Tony Hansford, Gary, and Tom Koziki. Q & A's:

- The curriculum for FT08 class is unchanged, even though there were a number of complaints from FT 07's about the heavy Winter workload. Kristin Bahfar's leadership work may be incorporated for incoming FT class
- Collaboration b/w FT & FEMBA's—Fair amount of communication b/c Tony and Gary regarding branding issues, new ideas are piloted in the FT programs, some electives will be open to both programs, possibility for more joint happy hour/socials. Tom had success at USC with a cross-career mixer b/t FT & FEMBA programs at USC, and suggests trying that at UCI as well.
- Rankings---Jumped up in US News, but down in Financial Times. What was the short coming? In US, US News and Business Week are most valued. Abroad (Europe and Asia, mainly), Financial Times is more highly regarded. Therefore, global schools are more actively participating in those rankings and spreading the American schools out in the ranks.
- Job Search—The Career has a more vigorous approach planned for coming years. More self-assessment of where you are in your career when you enter school and where you would like to be when you graduate, and what steps to take to get you to your end result. Marketing and Corporate outreach will continue to be an integral part of the Career Center's goals.

- Role of student clubs—Orient your club membership around your particular industry. Partner with others (Career Center, CLD, etc) to make a more meaningful event (resume critiques, industry guest speakers, etc)
- Improving Career Workshops—They were on video tape, so Tom has reviewed them to improve them. He has plans to improve them by making them more interactive, more discussion based, hw assigned and will reconvene to go over it.
- FEMBA conflicting schedule with various Career Events—There have been improvements in recent years to accommodate FEMBA schedules, but it's tough to accommodate everyone. Tony and Tom are considering having events on Saturdays.
- Suggestion to enhance Catalyst to include data about companies students have interviewed at. This helps students make contacts with companies of interest. Students are encouraged to edit their personal bio on catalyst to keep it up to date for other students to reference. Alums are encouraged to more actively participate with the school (Dean's Leadership Circle is one such initiative)
- Tom would like to have a meeting with all the club presidents to discuss future direction of clubs.
